Great Lakes Ginseng farm is located in remote hardwood forests near the shores of Lake Superior in Northern Michigan. (Barb adds: on Heinola Hillside) By growing our ginseng under the natural canopy of oak and maple forests, the root takes on the characteristics of wild ginseng. Each year the root remains in the ground increases its wild properties and medicinal effects.

We are the largest grower of American woods-grown ginseng in North America. In fall 2007, we harvested primarily 10-year-old root along with a small quantity of 9- and 11-year-old root. Because of the high quality of our ginseng, most ginseng harvested this year was sold prior to the beginning of harvest and orders exceeded supply. In fall 2008, we will again be harvesting primarily 10-year-old root and encourage prospective buyers to contact us early. In 2008, we will be selling 10- and 11-year-old fresh ginseng from June to September as well as during harvest. We have also added ginseng powder to the products we offer.
